SPEAKER OF THE MONTH

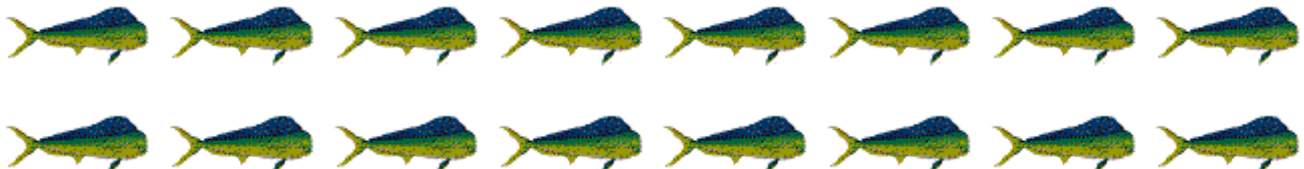
Guest Speaker for May 26th **Commander Bruce Parmett**

FISHING REPORT

IT'S KINGFISH SEASON

Big fish are biting and you should be on the water as often as you can for as long as you can. Almost everyone is catching kingfish, dolphin, wahoo and even some really big amberjacks. Bonito continue to be a heavily caught fish when fishing over the rock reefs, however this is a good sign and we must tolerate these fish and make use of them as a bait source.

Kingfish are biting for anglers during the day and night. Bonito are active during the day and wahoo are biting during mid to late morning. Use live baits for best catch totals. Use a bonito strip covered with a purple plastic skirt as a bait for wahoo. Just make sure to get the bait at least 40 to 60 feet deep and then troll as if you would for dolphin.

With the kingfish season in full swing, you can expect some of your fish to get cut in half by big barracuda, bigger kingfish, or perhaps a shark. Several fish caught by drift boat anglers are being cut in half. Kingfish and Bonito are the usual victims.

The ocean has been better for fishing in the early morning hours but has had a tendency to get a lot rougher during the late part of the afternoon. Make sure you know your boat and its capabilities before trying to handle rough conditions at any of the inlets.

Anglers fishing from the Intracoastal should be looking for more and bigger fish. Jacks and snook are active as are sheepshead, sand perch and mangrove snappers. Live shrimp will be your best all around bait in the lagoon, but live baits will produce a good number of fish like snook and barracuda.
